New Special Annuals for 2013

Although this is a year we are trying to be more conservative, and keep our love for new items under control, we can not ignore the increased interest in new and exciting specialty annuals. Having said that, here is our list on new special annuals. Sorry, I could not control myself.



Coleus 'Dirty Martini' (above) 'Shiney Shoes' and 'Wasabi' – New brightly colored coleus. We found these when we were out visiting other garden centers.

Cordyline 'Torbay Dazzler' (bottom) – A new green and white spike like foliage plant.

Cyperus involucratus - Dwarf papyrus that can get only 2' tall. Great for containers.

Evolvulus 'Blue My Mind' (below)- Beautiful blue flower that is heat and drought resistant.



Heliotrope 'Topaz' – Improved variety of Marine heliotrope.

Lobularia Silver (upper right) and Lavender Stream – When I was in Israel last Feb. I saw this growing and loved the more compact growth of this aggressive continuous flowering allysum.



Pennisetum 'Sky Rocket' – We all love the red bladed pennisetum. Well this is a variegated white and green variety.

Petunia and Calibrachoa – We have **Petunia Watermelon Charm, Ray Sunflower, Blanket Rose Star, Superbells Blue,** and the hottest new variety is **Superbells Lemon Slice (below)** that is yellow and white stripes.



Sutera (Bacopa) – Betty Blue, Betty Pink and Betty White. For those of you that love Bacopa we have 3 colors this year.

OBITUARY FOR ELISABETH HAZLETT SHELDON

Elisabeth was born in Lagrange, Illinois during a blizzard on January 19th, 1918. She passed away in her home on February 10, 2013. She was raised near Chicago and Boston by her father, Ralph Hazlett, who worked in Industrial Relations and her mother, Jean Vanderlaag Hazlett. She had an older sister, Lois, and a younger brother and sister, Don and Ruthie. She attended the Art Institute of Chicago for five years, then taught at Todd School in Woodstock. She married sculptor Robert Moir and they had a son, Paul Anthony Sheldon-Moir. She and Robert later divorced. She attended a French class at the University of Chicago where she met George Sheldon. It was love at first sight and they were married at her family home.

They moved to Washington DC for George's position with the State Department and had two girls, Ayne and Connie (Joanna). They then moved to Saigon, followed by Izmir, Florence, Washington DC, and Algiers, spending about two years in each place. Elisabeth taught English as a Second Language in Saigon and Izmir and continued to work as an artist. She had successful shows of her oil landscapes in all these cities. When George got his position as a professor of Linguistics at Cornell, they settled in Ithaca. They bought an old farmhouse in Lansing and Elisabeth, now in her fifties, created a beautiful garden where she grew and sold plants for ten years. She later lectured extensively, sharing her knowledge of plants and gardening. She wrote articles for horticulture magazines, and three books about horticulture and gardening – *A Proper Garden*, *The Flamboyant Garden*, and *Time and the Gardener* – two of which won three national awards. She also wrote an as-yet unpublished account of three 19th-century women writers, and in recent years she wrote her memoirs. She was actively involved with the Auraca Herbarists in Ithaca and various horticultural and gardening organizations. Elisabeth is survived by her brother and her two daughters. Her family and friends will miss her bright bold spirit, her drive, and her crisp humor.

Perennial of the Year:

Polygonatum odoratum



“Variegatum”

Hardy to Zone 3-8 loves shade can take about 4hrs. of sun. Prefers moist soil. Grows to about 18-24" spreads 24-30". Spreads by rhizomes to form colonies. Variegated leaves are light green with white tips and margins. Leaves turn an attractive yellow in autumn. Pairs of small bell-shaped white flowers with green tips and margins. Flowers are present in late spring and are sweetly fragrant. Bluish-black berries are sometimes present in the autumn.

Herb of the Year:



“Elder”

(*Sambucus*)

It's time to 'Respect you Elder' featuring one of the herb world's most useful plants. Elder has been in your medicine chest, prominent in folklore, used in numerous ways to protect and heal, create tasty beverages and food. Elderberry's tart, deep purple berries are used in jams, jellies, chutneys, preserves, and wine. The dried blossoms are used

in tea blends. Elder flower water was one of those traditional half-home spun elegances that belonged on a lady's dressing table. Yellow and violet dyes can be made from the leaves and berries.

Downie Mildew on Impatiens



This is a very hard subject to write about. But it has to be done. Downie Mildew has travelled across Europe and made it's way into the United States. Unfortunately it will kill all of the Impatiens walleriana which are the landscape types and the double flowering varieties. It was in New England last year and moved into central NY by the end of the summer. Ithaca has reported several cases. Your plants start to look yellowish and the leaves curl downward. Then the plant crashes and dies.

Cathy and I had to make the very hard decision that after growing impatiens for 30 years, we are no longer going to grow or sell them. We still will have the New Guinea varieties because they are not affected by DM. We even will be selling them in a cell pack for those who want to replace them for the bedding impatiens. Other shade loving annuals are coleus, begonias, browallia, torenia and many others. Cathy of course has many shade loving perennials for those who want to convert an annual garden to a perennial one. Whew! That is over and now on to much more pleasant topics.

House News

Once again we will be growing the herbs and vegetables organically. During the growing season last year if you were to walk into the herb house while we were watering you probably would have smelled a strong odor of fish. That was the fertilizer we used. We found through the growing season that the fish emulsion was not enough. So we will be using another organic fertilizer on the plants along with the fish emulsion to keep our plants looking great for you. As we have in the past years, we will still be working with IPM Labs to monitor pest management. Michele will scout for us again this year. We have had a lot of good results with using beneficial controls and feel each year we learn new ways to keep our plants pest free.

New Perennials for 2013

Again this year I have added about 50 new perennials. I will list just a few so be sure to go online for a new perennial list. I am really excited about my choices. You will find on the perennial list that I have marked the new ones with a*.

Aralia cordata 'Sun King' – Very large compound, bright gold leaves. Tiny white flowers give way to purple-black berries in fall. Grows to 3 ft. in part shade. Zone 3 – 9 Deer resistant.
Coreopsis 'Mercury Rising' – Velvety wine red blossoms. Some blossoms have lightly frosted white tips. Grows 15-18" in full sun. Zone 5-9



Darmera (Umbrella Plant) – (above) Large, rounded clusters of red-centered, blush-white flowers rise on thick stalks before the clumped foliage. Grows 30" shade to partial shade moist rich soil. Zone 4-7

Echinacea 'Pineapple Sundae' (below)– The first double yellow, longer golden outer ray petals relax and droop as the flower matures. Grows 26-28" sun to part shade. Zone 4-9



Gillenia (Indian Physics) – (below) - Lovely airy bush-forming perennial of rich-green, lanceolate leaves on branching stems. Which are red in color as they sprout outwards in early summer. Wispy, white star-shaped flowers litter the plant from late spring till mid-summer. Grows 25" in part shade. Zone 4-8

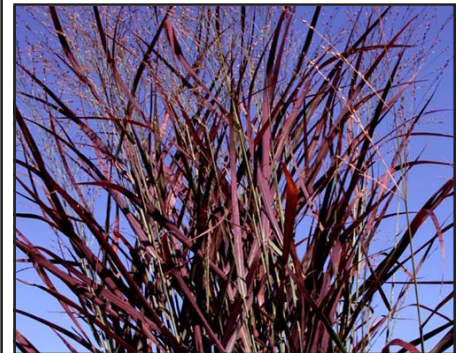


Stokesia laevis 'Honeysong Purple' – (below) - Neatly mounding plants with deep green foliage, large 3" royal purple flowers with red tinged centers. Grows 14" full sun. Zone 5-9 Deer resistant



Viola 'Heartthrob' – Heart shaped green serrated leaves with a wide burgundy splash creates a colorful ground cover. Grows 6-8" Part shade to full shade. Zone 5-9 Deer resistant
Carex glauca 'Blue Zinger' – Steel blue clumps of foliage create a sea of blue when planted in drifts. Grows 10-18" sun to part shade. Zone 4-9 Deer resistant

Miscanthus sinensis 'Rigoletto' – Compact with strong, creamy-white and green longitudinal variegation. Grows 3-5' sun. Zone 5-10 Deer resistant



Panicum virgatum 'Hot Rod' – (above) - Firmly upright blades emerge blue-green reddening rapidly until the whole plant is a rich, deep maroon. Grows 36-40" sun. Zone 4-10 Deer resistant
